Why Sepsis Bundle Compliance Matters




- LTACH patients are medically complex and high-risk
- Recognition delays = worse outcomes
- Bundle compliance supports early intervention and saves lives



What Happens When We Miss It

- Delayed recognition = delayed antibiotics = poorer outcomes
- More ICU transfers, higher costs, longer stays
- LTACHs need fast systems for detection






Delayed Action = Worse Outcomes

- Early action = shorter stays and fewer readmissions
 - Timely treatment reduces need for escalation
 - Helps teams and improves patient experience

- We bridge acute care and long-term recovery
- Early detection is our responsibility
